

Good Faith Estimate Availability Notice

You have the right to receive a “Good Faith Estimate” explaining how much your oral surgery care will cost.

Under the law, health care providers need to give patients who don't have insurance or who are not using insurance an estimate of the bill for medical items and services.

- You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any non-emergency items or services. This includes related costs like medical tests, prescription drugs, equipment, and hospital fees.
- You may request a good faith estimate at any time, or one will be provided to you at your consultation appointment. You may request this estimate by paper, secure email, or you may pick up a Good Faith Estimate at one of our locations.
- If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.
